1. **GENERAL INFORMATION**

2.2 Basis of measurement

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis.

2.3 Functional and presentation currency

The financial statements are presented in Ringgit Malaysia (RM), which is the Company's functional currency.

2.4 Use of estimates and judgements

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The areas involving a higher degree of judgement or complexity, or areas where assumptions and estimates are significant to the financial statements, are disclosed in Note 4 to the financial statements.

3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounting policies set out below have been consistently applied by the Group and are consistent with those used in the previous financial year, unless otherwise stated.

3.1 **Basis of consolidation**

The consolidated financial statements comprise the financial statements of the Company and its subsidiaries as at the balance sheet date. The financial statements of the subsidiaries are prepared for the same reporting date as the Company.

Subsidiaries are consolidated from the date of acquisition, being the date on which the Group obtains control, and continued to be consolidated until the date that such control ceases. In preparing the consolidated financial statements, intragroup balances, transactions and unrealised gains or losses are eliminated in full. Uniform accounting policies are adopted in the consolidated financial statements for like transactions and events in similar circumstances.

Acquisitions of subsidiaries are accounted for using the purchase method. The purchase method of accounting involves allocating the cost of the acquisition to the fair value of the assets acquired and liabilities and contingent liabilities assumed at the date of acquisition. The cost of an acquisition is measured as the aggregate of the fair values, at the date of exchange, of the assets given, liabilities incurred or assumed, and equity instruments issued, plus any costs directly attributable to the acquisition.

Any excess of the cost of the acquisition over the Group's interest in the net fair value of the identifiable assets, liabilities and contingent liabilities represents goodwill. It is tested for impairment annually and carried at cost less accumulated impairment losses.

Any excess of the Group's interest in the net fair value of the identifiable assets, liabilities and contingent liabilities over the cost of acquisition is recognised immediately in profit or loss.

3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Cont'd)

3.2 Property, plant and equipment

- (i) All items of property, plant and equipment are initially recorded at cost. Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Group and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. The carrying amount of any replaced part is derecognised. All other repairs and maintenance are charged to the income statement during the financial period in which they are incurred. Subsequent to recognition, property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses, if any.
- (ii) Capital work-in-progress is not depreciated until the property, plant and equipment are fully completed and brought into use. Depreciation of other property, plant and equipment is provided for on the straight-line basis to write off the cost of the assets over their estimated useful lives. The annual rates used are as follows:-

Land and buildings Over the lease term of 60 years and 5% Buildings, drainage and roads 4% - 10%

Nursery irrigation systems

Motor vehicles, plant and machinery

Equipment and furniture

10% - 20%

10% - 20%

- (iii) The residual values, useful life and depreciation method are reviewed at each financial year-end to ensure that the amount, method and period of depreciation are consistent with previous estimates and the expected pattern of consumption of the future economic benefits embodied in the items of property, plant and equipment.
- (iv) An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. The difference between the net disposal proceeds, if any and the net carrying amount is recognised in profit or loss.

3.3. Prepaid lease rentals

Leasehold land that normally has an indefinite economic life and title is not expected to pass to the lessee by the end of the lease term is treated as an operating lease. The payment made on entering into or acquiring a leasehold land is accounted for as prepaid lease rentals and are amortised over the lease term, ranging from 53 to 85 years.

The Group had previously classified leases of land as finance leases and had recognised the amount of prepaid lease rentals as property within its property, plant and equipment. On early adoption of FRS 117: Leases, the Group treats such leases as operating leases, with the unamortised carrying amount classified as prepaid lease rentals in accordance with the transitional provision provided in FRS 117.

Where a lease payment cannot be allocated reliably between land and buildings, then the entire lease is classified as a finance lease, and the lease of land and buildings is included within property, plant and equipment.

3.4. Biological assets

Planting expenditure incurred on land clearing, upkeep of immature oil palms, administrative expenses and interest incurred during the pre-cropping period is capitalised at cost as biological assets. Upon maturity, all subsequent maintenance expenditure is charged to income statement. Pre-cropping cost is amortised on a straight-line basis over 25 years, the expected useful life of oil palm trees.

3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Cont'd)

3.5. **Subsidiaries**

Subsidiaries are entities over which the Group has power to govern the financial and operating policies so as to obtain benefits from their activities. The Group generally has such power when it, directly or indirectly, holds more than 50% of the issued share capital, or controls more than half of the voting power, or controls the composition of the board of directors.

In the Company's separate financial statements, investment in subsidiaries is accounted for at cost less impairment losses.

On disposal of the investment, the difference between net disposal proceeds and its carrying amount is charged/credited to the Company's income statement.

3.6. Inventories

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Net realisable value represents the estimated selling price less costs to be incurred in marketing, selling and distribution.

Costs incurred in bringing each product to its present location and condition are accounted for as follows: -

Sundry stores and consumables - original cost of purchase, determined on a weighted average basis.

Processed inventories - cost of raw materials, direct labour and an appropriate proportion of production overheads, determined on a first-in first-out basis.

3.7. Financial instruments

Financial instruments are recognised in the balance sheet when the Group has become a party to the contractual provisions of the instruments.

Financial instruments are classified as liabilities or equity in accordance with the substance of the contractual arrangement. Interest, dividends and gains and losses relating to a financial instrument classified as a liability, are reported as expense or income. Distributions to holders of financial instruments classified as equity are recognised directly in equity. Financial instruments are offset when the Group has a legally enforceable right to offset and intends to settle either on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash and bank balances, bank overdrafts, deposits and other short term, highly liquid investments which are readily convertible to cash and which are subject to insignificant risk of changes in value.

Receivables

Receivables are carried at anticipated realisable values. Bad debts are written off when identified. An estimate is made for doubtful debt based on a review of all outstanding amounts as at the balance sheet date.

Payables

Payables are stated at cost which is the fair value of the consideration to be paid in the future for goods and services received.

Interest-bearing borrowings

Interest-bearing borrowings are recorded at the fair value of the proceeds, net of transaction costs incurred.

3.7. Financial instruments - (Cont'd)

Equity instruments

Ordinary shares are recorded at the nominal value and proceeds in excess of the nominal value of share issued, if any, are accounted for as share premium. Both ordinary shares and share premium are classified as equity. Costs incurred directly attributable to the issuance of shares are accounted for as a deduction from share premium. Otherwise they are charged to the income statement.

Dividends on ordinary shares are recognised in equity in the period in which they are declared.

3.8. Impairment of assets

The carrying amounts of the Group's assets, other than financial assets (except for investments), inventories and deferred tax assets, are reviewed at each balance sheet date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any such indication exists, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated. An impairment loss is recognised whenever the carrying amount of an item of the assets exceeds its recoverable amount. An impairment loss is charged to the income statement.

The recoverable amount is the higher of net selling price and value in use, which is measured by reference to discounted future cash flows. Recoverable amounts are estimated for individual assets or, if it is not possible, for the cash-generating unit to which the assets belong.

Impairment loss on goodwill is not reversed in a subsequent period. An impairment loss for an asset other than goodwill is reversed if there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the recoverable amount.

An impairment loss is reversed only to the extent that the asset's carrying amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined, net of depreciation or amortisation, if no impairment loss has been recognised. The reversal is recognised in the income statement, unless it reverses an impairment loss on a revalued asset, in which case it is taken to equity.

3.9. **Provisions**

Provisions are recognised when the Group has a present obligation (legal or constructive) where, as a result of a past event, it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

3.10. Employee benefits

(i) Short-term employee benefits

Wages, salaries, social security contributions and bonuses are recognised as an expense in the financial year when employees have rendered their services to the Group.

(ii) Defined contribution plan

As required by law, companies in Malaysia make contributions to the national pension scheme, the Employees Provident Fund. Such contributions are recognised as an expense in the income statement as incurred.

3.11. Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognised on the following basis:-

Dividend income is recognised when the shareholder's right to receive payment is established.

Revenue from sale of goods is measured at the fair value of the consideration receivable and is recognised in the income statement when the significant risks and rewards of ownership have been transferred to the buyers.

Revenue from services rendered is recognised net of discount as and when the services are performed.

Management fee is recognised when services are rendered.

3.12. Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs directly attributable to planting expenditure are capitalised as part of the cost of those assets, until such time as the assets are ready for their intended use. All other borrowing costs are charged to the income statement as an expense in the period in which they are incurred.

3.13. **Income tax**

Income tax on the profit or loss for the year comprises current and deferred tax. Current tax is the expected amount of income taxes payable in respect of the taxable profit for the year and is measured using the tax rates that have been enacted at the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax is provided for, using the liability method. In principle, deferred tax liabilities are recognised for all taxable temporary differences and deferred tax assets are recognised for all deductible temporary differences, unused tax losses and unused tax credits to the extent that it is probable that taxable profit will be available against which the deductible temporary differences, unused tax losses and unused tax credits can be utilised. Deferred tax is not recognised if the temporary difference arises from goodwill or negative goodwill or from the initial recognition of an asset or liability in a transaction which is not a business combination and at the time of the transaction, affects neither accounting profit nor taxable profit.

Deferred tax is measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the period when the asset is realised or the liability is settled, based on tax rates that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is recognised as income or an expense and included in the profit or loss for the period, except when it arises from a transaction which is recognised directly in equity, in which case the deferred tax is also recognised directly in equity, or when it arises from a business combination that is an acquisition, in which case the deferred tax is included in the resulting goodwill or the amount of any excess of the acquirer's interest in the net fair value of the acquiree's identifiable assets, liabilities and contingent liabilities over the cost of the combination.

4. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING ESTIMATES AND JUDGEMENTS

Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

4. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING ESTIMATES AND JUDGEMENTS - (Cont'd)

4.1. Critical judgements made in applying accounting policies

In the process of preparing the financial statements, there were no significant judgements made by management in applying the accounting policies that may have significant effects on the financial statements.

4.2. Key sources of estimation uncertainty

The key assumptions concerning the future and other sources of estimation uncertainty at the balance sheet date, that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year are discussed below:

Depreciation of property, plant and equipment

Depreciation of property, plant and equipment is based on management's estimates of the future estimated useful lives and residual values of property, plant and equipment. Changes in the expected level of usage and technological developments could impact the economic useful lives and the residual values of these assets and therefore, depreciation expenses could be changed.

During the financial year, the useful life of plantation infrastructure development expenditure which is included within buildings, drainage and roads was revised from 20 years to 25 years. The revision was accounted for prospectively as a change in accounting estimates and as a result, the depreciation charge for the Group for the current financial year has been reduced by RM326,368.

Amortisation of biological assets

Biological assets are amortised on a straight-line basis over the expected useful life of oil palm trees. Significant management judgement is required to determine the expected useful life of oil palm trees, based on such factor as soil condition.

During the financial year, the useful life of biological assets was revised from 20 years to 25 years, the current expected useful life of oil palm trees. The revision was accounted for prospectively as a change in accounting estimates and as a result, the amortisation charge for the Group for the current financial year has been reduced by RM1,042,665.

Deferred tax assets

Deferred tax assets are recognised for all unused tax losses and unabsorbed capital allowance to the extent that it is probable that taxable profit will be available against which the Group can utilise the benefits derived therefrom. Significant management judgement is required to determine the amount of deferred tax assets that can be recognised, based upon the likely timing and level of future taxable profits together with future tax planning strategies. The Directors are in the opinion that there will be no substantial change in the shareholders before these tax benefits are utilised.

Details of the carrying amounts of recognised deferred tax assets are contained in Note 9 to the financial statements.

The Group's normal trade credit terms range from 7 to 30 days. Other credit terms are assessed and approved on a case-to-case basis.

The Group has exposure to an individual customer. However, this does not pose any significant credit risk to the Group.

12. AMOUNT DUE FROM/(TO) SUBSIDIARY COMPANIES

The amount due from/(to) subsidiary companies is unsecured, interest-free and has no fixed terms of repayment.

31. FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES AND POLICIES

The Group's overall financial risk management objective is to optimise the value creation for shareholders. In addition, the Group seeks to ensure that adequate financial resources are available for the development of the Group's businesses whilst managing its risks.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS - CONTINUED FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST AUGUST 2007

31. FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES AND POLICIES - (Cont'd)

The main areas of financial risks faced by the Group and the policies for the controlling and management of these risks are set out below: -

(a) Market risk

The Group, in the normal course of business, is exposed to market risks in respect of volatility in market prices of oil palm products.

(b) Interest rate risk

The Group's primary interest rate risk relates to interest-bearing debts, as the Group had no substantial long-term interest-earning assets as at 31 August 2007. The investments in financial assets are mainly short-term in nature and they are not held for speculative purposes but have been mostly placed as short-term deposits with licensed financial institutions.

The Group manages its interest rate exposure by maintaining a prudent mix of fixed and floating rate borrowings.

(c) Credit risk

Credit risk, or the risk of counterparties defaulting, is controlled by the application of credit approvals, limits and monitoring procedures. Credit risks are minimised and monitored by limiting the Group's associations to business partners with high creditworthiness. Trade receivables are monitored on an ongoing basis.

(d) Liquidity and cash flow risk

The Group manages its debt maturity profile, operating cash flows and availability of funding so as to ensure that all refinancing, repayment and funding needs are met. As part of its overall prudent liquidity management, the Group maintains sufficient levels of cash to meet its working capital requirements. In addition, the Group strives to maintain available banking facilities of a reasonable level to its overall debt position. As far as possible, the Group raises committed funding from both capital markets and financial institutions and prudently balances its portfolio with some short-term funding so as to achieve overall cost effectiveness.

- (ii) It is not practical to estimate the fair values of amount owing to/from the subsidiaries due to the lack of fixed repayment terms and the inability to estimate fair values without incurring excessive costs. However, the Group does not anticipate the carrying amounts recorded at the balance sheet date to be significantly different from the values that would eventually be received or settled.
- (iii) The fair values of borrowings are estimated by discounting the future contractual cash flows at the current interest rate available to the Group for similar financial instruments.

32. SIGNIFICANT SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

On 12th October 2007, the Company announced the following proposed acquisitions:-

- (i) acquisition of 85% equity interest in Baram Trading Sdn Bhd comprising 4,250,000 ordinary shares of RM1.00 each for an indicative purchase consideration of RM18,417,000 to be satisfied in cash; and
- (ii) acquisition of 85% equity interest in Nescaya Palma Sdn Bhd comprising 2,125,000 ordinary shares of RM1.00 each for an indicative purchase consideration of RM32,250,000 to be satisfied in cash.

The above proposed acquisitions have been approved by Foreign Investment Committee vide its letter dated 23 November 2007 and are now pending the approval of the shareholders of the Company at an extraordinary general meeting.

33. CHANGES IN ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Prior to 1st September 2006, goodwill was written off in the financial year it arose. The adoption of FRS 3 has resulted in the Group ceasing annual goodwill amortisation. Goodwill, which is carried at cost less accumulated impairment losses, is now tested for annual impairment. Any impairment loss is recognised in profit and loss and subsequent reversal is not allowed.

The change in accounting policy had no effect on the financial statements as the goodwill had been fully written off as at 31st August 2007.

In addition, under FRS 3, any excess of the Group's interest in the net fair value of acquirees' identifiable assets, liabilities and contingent liabilities over cost of acquisitions (previously referred to as "negative goodwill"), after reassessment, is recognised immediately in profit or loss. Prior to 1st September 2006, the Group reflected the negative goodwill as reserve on consolidation and was amortised over 10 years.

The change in accounting policy has been accounted for prospectively and as such there is no restatement of comparatives. In accordance with the transitional provisions of FRS 3, the reserve on consolidation as at 1st September 2006 of RM5,952,177 was derecognised with a corresponding increase in retained earnings.

(b) FRS 101: Presentation of Financial Statements

Prior to 1st September 2006, plantation development expenditure comprising oil palm planting expenditure and plantation infrastructure development expenditure was classified under property, plant and equipment.

The oil palm planting expenditure is now disclosed as a separate item on the balance sheet as biological assets. Roads and bridges previously included in plantation development expenditure have been separately categorised as buildings, drainage and roads under property, plant and equipment.

The change in presentation has been applied retrospectively and as disclosed in Note 34, certain comparatives have been restated. The effects on the balance sheet as at 31st August 2007 are disclosed in the respective notes to the financial statements.

There were no effects on the income statement for the year ended 31st August 2007.

(c) FRS 117: Leases

Prior to 1st September 2006, leasehold land held for own use was classified as property, plant and equipment and was stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. The adoption of the revised FRS 117 has resulted in a change in the accounting policy relating to the classification of leases of land and buildings. A lease of land and buildings is assessed separately. The minimum lease payments or the up-front payments made are split into two elements, a lease of land and a lease of buildings, in proportion to their relative fair values. The land element is now classified as an operating lease; whereas the buildings element is classified as a finance lease and is included within property, plant and equipment. The up-front payments represent prepaid lease rentals and are amortised on a straight-line basis over the lease term. In accordance with the transitional provisions of FRS 117, the unamortised amount of leasehold land as at 1st September 2006 is retained as the surrogate carrying amount of prepaid lease rentals.

The reclassification of leasehold land as prepaid lease rentals has been accounted for retrospectively and as disclosed in Note 34, certain comparatives have been restated. The effects on the balance sheet as at 31st August 2007 are disclosed in the respective notes to the financial statements.

There were no effects on the income statement for the year ended 31st August 2007.
